- Self-Control: Maintain emotional control, even when frustrated.
- **Continuous Improvement:** Always seek self-improvement and assist others in doing the same.
- Safety: Prioritize the safety of yourself and your training partners.
- **Non-discrimination:** Do not discriminate based on race, gender, religion, or any other factors.
- **Dojo Rules:** Follow the specific rules of your dojo.
- **National and International Rules:** Adhere to the rules set by your national judo federation and the International Judo Federation (IJF).

These principles of conduct are not only essential for creating a respectful and harmonious training environment but also for promoting the deeper philosophical aspects of judo, such as personal growth and character development. Judo practitioners are expected to embrace and embody these principles both on and off the mat.

#### Code of Conduct for Parents & Carers

- **Support and Encouragement:** Encourage and support your child's interest in judo and attend their events when possible.
- Respect for the Sport: Understand and respect the values of judo, such as courtesy, integrity, and perseverance.
- Safety First: Trust coaches and officials to keep participants safe. Ensure your child has the right safety gear.
- Respect for Coaches and Officials: Follow the instructions of coaches and officials without argument.

- **Follow Club and Organizational Rules:** Abide by the rules of the judo club and organisations.
- **Promote Ethics and Values:** Teach and encourage your child to apply the ethical principles of judo both on and off the mat.

By adhering to this code of conduct, parents and caregivers can contribute to creating a respectful, safe, and positive environment for their children and other participants in the world of judo. Additionally, their support and guidance can help judo practitioners develop not only as athletes but also as responsible individuals who embody the principles of the sport.
